5th Monitoring Committee Meeting

Date: 3rd November, 2024

Venues: TRAction Conference Room, icddr,b

Fifth Monitoring Committee Meeting was held in 3rd of November, 2024 at TRAction Conference Room, icddr,b. Additional Secretary of Health Service Division, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare was the chairperson of this meeting. Decisions of the meeting are as follows,

- icddr,b will share the analyzed data of DHIS2 of 2022 and 2023 on Zero-Dose (ZD) and Under Immunized (UI) children with EPI Stakeholders
- Monitoring committee participants will visit ongoing fieldwork at implementation and Forcibly Displaced Myanmar Nationals (FDMN) research areas
- E-tracker training will take place in Implementation Research (IR) areas of Country Learning Hub on a priority basis
- The schedule of 2nd Co-creation workshop will be finalized by discussing with the chairperson of the Monitoring Committee next week

4 Rounds of Sub-National Committee Meetings

4 rounds of Sub-National Committee Meetings were held throughout the year, led by Civil Surgeons in districts and Chief Health Officers in city corporations, to review progress and address challenges in the identification, motivation, and vaccination of zero-dose (ZD) and under-immunized (UI) children. Members included representatives from health offices, EPI staff, WHO, UNICEF, and the project team. Key responsibilities included monitoring activities, providing feedback, ensuring vaccine logistics and cold chain management, and sharing project performance with monitoring committees.

Decisions were taken on the following:

 Evening sessions: Extend evening vaccination sessions to more wards in Zone 5, as they significantly increased vaccination among slum children, and reschedule missed sessions due to political disruptions.

- Vaccine supply: Zone-5 officials to liaise with EPI headquarters to resolve vaccine shortages.
- Vaccination of ZD/UI children: Vaccinators to prioritize immunization of all children identified through e-screening checklists.
- Supplementary immunization activities:
 Increase crash programs to vaccinate
 eligible children in rural hard-to-reach areas.
- Nalitabari fixed center: Provide vaccinations six days a week (up from two) due to a high number of eligible children.
- Training: icddr,b to conduct training for newly recruited health assistants and nurses in Dowarabazar. Training has been completed as per the committee's decision.
- Monthly meetings: Maintain ZD and UI discussions as agenda items in all monthly upazila and district-level meetings in IR areas.

These decisions aim to address operational challenges, improve vaccination coverage, and ensure that all eligible children receive timely immunization.



Identifying the zero-dose and under-immunized children in Bangladesh: Approaches and experiences

Date of Publication: 28 October 2024

This paper presents and elaborates on empirical methods and approaches used to identify Zero-Dose (ZD) and Under-immunized (UI) children as well as the communities that these children reside in within Bangladesh. Determinant analysis showed that the mother's level of education, antenatal visits made, and access to media were significantly associated with children being ZD or UI.
